The Department of Theatre Arts at Howard University invites applications for a part-time non-tenure track faculty position in the nationally renowned Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) Theatre Arts program. **This is a part-time, one-year appointment for AY 2022-23.** The position will work with the faculty of the AMPA Program, and faculty in the other four concentrations, to continue to build on the Program's many strengths for the training of aesthetic cultural activists in the broad fields of Theatre Arts.

As a historically Black private university committed to developing distinguished, historically aware, and compassionate graduates we seek an artist/educator with experience that will support our diverse student body and increase the incorporation of inclusive and forward-moving andragogies in our classrooms.

The ideal candidate will demonstrate success in teaching and guiding theatre students, proficiency in the art and crafts of theatre arts, relevant professional work in the field, scholarly contributions to the discipline and a commitment to Howard University's mission to create theatre leaders capable of driving change and solving problems for humanity through their involvement in the arts and culture industries of the world. The ideal candidate will also have a passion for remaining current in the field with regard to evolving styles, techniques, technologies, scholarship and andragogy in Theatre Arts.

Duties primarily include teaching theatre arts students:

Theatre History I (fall) - a lecture course examining the major movements, trends and styles in the development of theatre in the Western and African diasporic traditions from antiquity through the late 18th century. This class meets Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 2:10-3pm.

Theatre History II (spring) - a lecture course examining the major movements, trends and styles in the development of theatre in the Western and African diasporic traditions from the 18th century to the present. This class meets Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11:10am-12:30pm

The per-semester salary for this position is in the \$8,000-\$10,000 range.

PhD in Theatre Arts or related disciplines completed by date of employment.

Teaching experience at the university/college level.

Experience as a professional theatre arts scholar, published in major theatre journals.
