We are two miles from the U.S. Capitol where many students intern, scores of alumni, and our present Vice President of the United States shape national and foreign policy.




### ABOUT NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION

LANGUAGE	The Language Placement Exam (LPE) is administered in the following languages: Arabic, Chinese (traditional and simplified), Spanish, French, German, and Japanese. Every student who has studied a language and planning to take the same language at Howard University is required to take the Language Placement Examination.

CREDIT BY ADVANCED (AP)	New students entering Howard University may receive course credit for academic courses completed in secondary schools under the Advanced Placement Program administered by the College Board. AP scores must be sent directly from the College Board to the Office of Admission.
CREDIT BY INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)	Howard University will evaluate and award course credits for an IB examination score. The IB certificate must be sent directly to the Office of Admission.
TRANSFER TRANSCRIPTS	Howard University accepts academic courses from regionally accredited colleges and universities as transfer credits. Please provide an official and sealed copy of your transcript to the Department office and contact your Academic Advisor for more information.



#### How do I register for classes?

New students will be registered for at least 15 credits by an academic advisor.

#### Has registration begun?

Yes. New and continuing student registration is ongoing until September 1, 2023.

#### When will I be Registered?

Special populations, such as Army ROTC, and other groups who have predetermined activities will be registered first. Thereafter, students who have completed orientation, accepted their financial aid packages, and completed the mathematics and English placement exam will be registered, followed by remaining students.

### What are the registration requirements to maintain my scholarship?

University-based scholarship requirements vary by award. Scholarships generally require a minimum GPA and a minimum number of earned credits per semester. Please carefully review your scholarship contract.


### When can I meet with an advisor about course discrepancies and other issues?
